

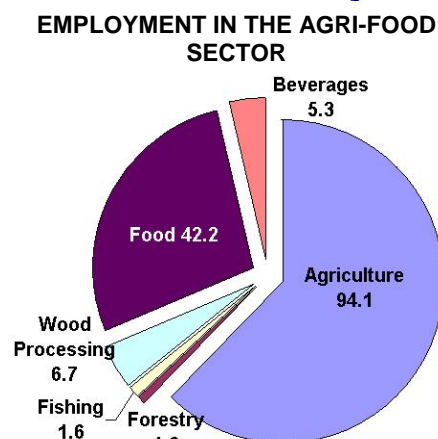

B: Public Expenditure and Agriculture Related Payments

Total public expenditure on the agri-food sector by the Department of Agriculture, Fisheries and Food was approximately €3.56 billion in 2008. DAFF payments in 2008 totalled over 2.6 billion in 2008 (full details outlined in Table below).

C: Estimates of Aggregate Agricultural Output, Input and Income

- The CSO's advance estimate of operating surplus in agriculture in 2009 is €1,619.7 million (full details outlined in Table below).
- In 2009, direct payments, net of levies, accounted for 117% of operating surplus.
- Beef and milk production currently account for 66% of agricultural output at producer prices (excl forage).

D: Estimates of Family Farm and Farm Household Income

- **The National Farm Survey (NFS)** produced by Teagasc estimates that average farm income (excluding off-farm income) decreased by 14% in 2008 to **€16,993**. Full-time farms, as defined by Teagasc, had an average farm income of €37,590, and part-time farms had an average of €7,580.
- The NFS also estimate that **79% of farmers and/or their spouses had an off-farm source of income** either from employment, pensions or social assistance. **On 40% of farms the holder had an off-farm job.**
- Special analysis of EU-SILC 2007 data shows that **farm households** have an **average total income of €56,184 or €48,708** (depending on whether a broad or narrow definition of "farm household" is utilised). These compare with a state average of €59,819.

F: Land Usage & Livestock Numbers

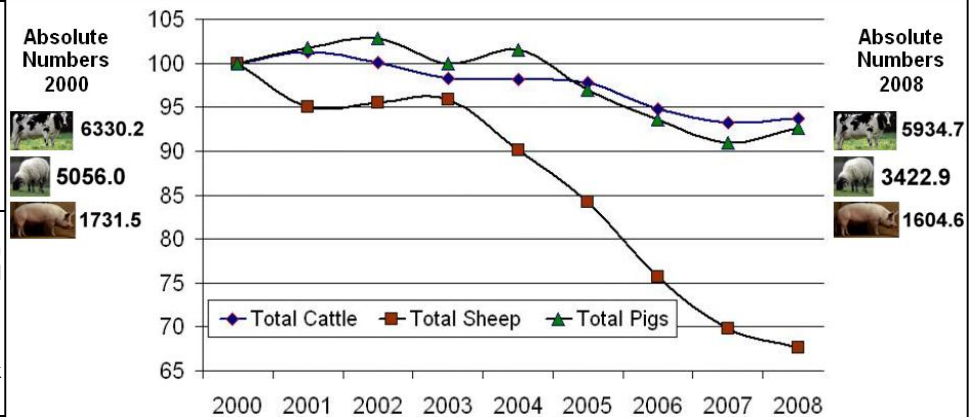
- The land area of Ireland is 6.9 million hectares; of which 4.2 million hectares is used for agriculture and a further 730,500 hectares for forestry, (see also area under crops in Table, right).
- Almost 80% of agricultural area is devoted to pasture, hay and grass silage (3.34 million hectares), 11% to rough grazing (0.45 million hectares) and 10% to crop production (0.42 million hectares).
- Average land prices in Ireland in 2008 were estimated to be €15,867 per acre. (Source: Irish Farmer's Journal Agricultural Land Price Report, 2008).

Chart (Right): Livestock Trends 2000-2008: Livestock Numbers¹ and Index²

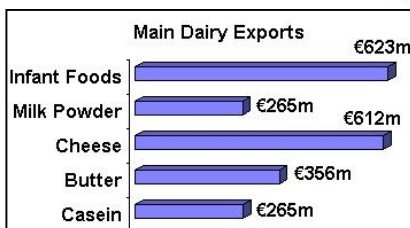
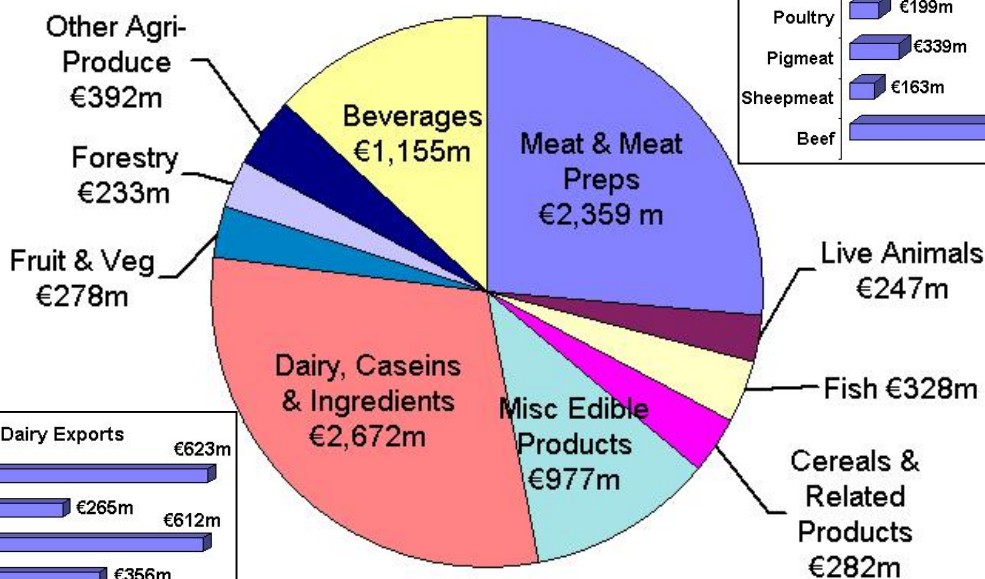
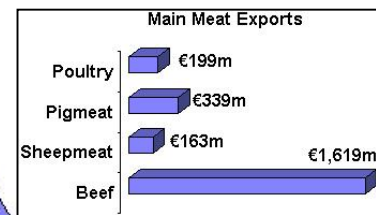
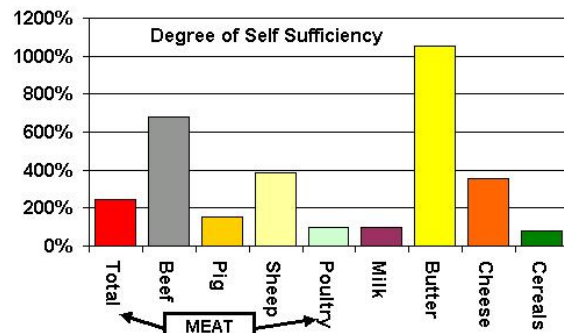
